WHAT'S NEW IN YOKOHAMA

Yokohama is a city in Kanagawa Prefecture, Japan. It has been the capital of Japanese culture since it opened to international trade in 1859.

A city that has grown exponentially since the 1960s, Yokohama has become a metropolitan area and is home to over three million people. There are many top-rated tourist attractions to be found in this city. So, what are some of the best things to do in Yokohama?



YOKOHAMA AIR CABIN

The newest attraction in Minato Mirai, Yokohama's central business district, is the Yokohama Air Cabin. This is Japan's newest aerial tram, and the first urban circular cable car anywhere.

The Yokohama Air Cabin creates a new attraction at Minato Mirai to promote tourism and give visitors an elevated view of the city.

It connects JR Sakuragichō Station and Unga Park in the Shinko District.

The station building and cabins were designed by world-famous lighting designer Ms. Motoko Ishii, and create quite a spectacle with their detailed lighting plan.

1: SANKEIEN GARDEN

“
**one of Japan's
most famous hidden gems**

Once the port at Yokohama opened in 1859 to foreign trade, the largest export from Japan was silk. By 1909, Japan had become the world's primary supplier of this fanciful fabric, serving American and European markets.

Hara Sankei, a Yokohama-based entrepreneur known for his silk trade, established the Sankeien Garden. The garden, is one of Japan's most famous hidden gems. Spanning about 175,000 square meters, Sankeien Garden has an outer garden that is open to the public and a private inner garden, formerly kept isolated for Sankei's personal use.

This expansive garden covers more than 117 acres and features 17 relocated buildings from Kyoto, Kamakura, and other places. The combination of rustic architecture and natural beauty appeals to visitors during any time of the year.

In addition to being a top tourist destination, Sankei Garden is also the cradle of modern Japanese culture, including art, literature, and even a tea ceremony. In 2007, the garden was granted national scenic beauty status, and it remains highly acclaimed for its cultural significance.

5: SHIN-YOKOHAMA RAUMEN MUSEUM

Founded in 1994, Shin-Yokohama Raumen Museum is the world's first food-themed amusement park. It was created in response to a call from ramen enthusiasts.

In 1997, the building was renovated. To commemorate 20 successful years of business, they expanded on their long-standing ramen concept to include areas outside of Japan, to further showcase this enormously popular dish among international citizens.

Proudly offering a prime selection of restaurants from across all of Japan. Visitors can get a taste of popular ramen stores while dining in an atmosphere reminiscent of Japan in 1958 – the year when instant ramen was born.
